Michael R. Rothlisberger, age 67 of Upper Sandusky died Sun. Nov. 27, 2016 at Fairhaven Health Care Community. He was born Jan. 17, 1949 to the late Louis & Flora (Brown) (Rothlisberger) Coons. At the age of 9 Michael's father died and his mother married Joseph Coons who preceded him in death. He was also preceded in death by his daughter Anne Bacon who died June 18, 2015 and a sister Barbara (Fred) Green.

He married Suzanne Touchette on Jan. 29, 1972 in John Stewart UMC, and they later separated. Mr. Rothlisberger taught English & Social Studies for the 8th and 9th grade levels for over 20 years, and was an administrator, football and track coach throughout his teaching career. He loved children and students, and would do anything to help advance their studies, and he did not care if the administration agreed with his methods. Mr. Rothlisberger enjoyed music from the 60's, reading, car shows, collecting ties and movie memorabilia. He was an avid OSU Buckeyes and Pittsburgh Steelers fan.

He and I sang tunes all the time when he worked at Ridgedale. He used it as a fun way of connecting to students and a generation of parents who appreciated his humor and easy punishment.

We often ended written phone messages with a 60's or 70's song title that would drum through our heads the rest of the day.

Sometimes if a student came to the office with a write up but could 'name that tune' Mike would give a half hearted serious look and say, "behave." He would squint, smile, shrug his shoulders and give the student a free pass back to their next class. He felt the staff member and student only needed a few minutes of space to feel normal again.

Mike encouraged me to be a become a volunteer working for him with students who desired to join his "You are worthy" type camp that he wanted to open someday out west. He wanted every student who felt like an under dog to feel "worthy." When he felt defeated by frustrated students and felt he needed some sort of back up he would pull me into the office to tell those students each person belongs someplace special with people who care about them. Then he would tell the student we can all run away together out west if that child could create an escape route without getting any of us in trouble with the school or the law. In saying this the student was required to either write out the plan in detail or go back to class and behave. As you can guess writing seemed to be to much work so they returned to class with a quieted attitude! Problem solved!

He was a non- bossy type of boss. He made me laugh.

Winters may be cold in Ohio, but Mike had a warm heart. He was always California dreamin'.

Authorities take heed. He was good. He will be missed.
