It is with great sadness that the family of Albert Clinger announces the passing Albert Benjamin Clinger on June 17, 2021 at the age of 85. Albert was born on October 8, 1935 in Wyandot County to Wilbur Edwin and Gail Lucille (McDaniel) Clinger.

He was the seventh of nine children. Elsie Elizabeth (Clinger) Hummel, Dr. Edwin James Clinger, Dr. Philip Charles Clinger, Joyce Ellen (Clinger) Loepprich, Julia Irene (Clinger) Weaver, Ann Louise (Clinger) Loeffler, Ferne Lucille (Clinger) Allan, Frank Wilbur Clinger.

He was preceded by his parent Wilbur and Gail Clinger, and his sisters Elsie Elizabeth (Clinger) Hummel and Julia Irene (Clinger) Weaver and a brother Dr. Philip Charles Clinger

Albert was in the 1953 graduating class of Upper Sandusky High School. He served in the U.S. Army from 1953 to 1956, during his time he was stationed in Germany and received an honorable discharge. Albert attended electronics school and worked as an electrician, both for Harris Electric and his own company, Clinger Electric. He also managed the family farm. Mr. Clinger was a lifetime member of the Salem United Methodist Church in Mifflin Township.

Albert never married but enjoyed spending time with his many nieces and

nephews. His favorite hobbies were growing black walnut trees and peanuts, and catching and eating the legs of frogs caught from the creek by his house. He was a quiet person and was known for his dry wit and sense of humor.

A graveside service will be held on Sat. June 26, 2021 at 11:00 a.m. in the Salem UMC Cemetery, Mifflin Twp. Wyandot Co. Military honors will be conducted by Upper Sandusky Veterans Color Guard.
