Albert J. Bills, age 93 of Upper Sandusky died at 12:30 a.m. on Mon. July 23, 2012 at The Inn at Westbrook, Upper Sandusky. He was born May 5, 1919 in Holgate to the late Henry O. Bills and Maria Louise Triphonia (Lippens) Bills.
