A. Louise Stober, age 93 of Upper Sandusky died on Tuesday April 27, 2010 in the Wyandot Memorial Hospital. She was born on Dec.30, 1916 in Upper Sandusky to Theodore and Susanna (Thiel) Bolish.

Louise married John O. Stober on Sept. 4, 1945 in the St. Peter Rectory and he preceded her in death on May 24, 1979. She has one son John W. "Bill" (Shirley) Stober of Sycamore, 4 grandchildren Shawn Stober, Jason Stober, Jennifer Kesler, Michelle Stober, 5 great grandchildren Grace & Emma Stober, Allison & Adam Kesler, Kaden Stober. She was preceded in death by brothers Edward, Aloysius, Gerald, sisters Dorothy Bolish, Lillian Klopp, Geraldine Kromer, Madeline Dendinger, Catherine Bolish, and Harold & Rosemary who died in infancy.

She graduated from Upper Sandusky High School in 1934. She worked at and was part owner of the family owned Bolish Restaurant. Louise had also worked as a clerk at the former Neumeister Bakery and had worked at Kimmel Cleaner. She retired after working 10 years at Bond Plastics.

She was a life member of St. Peter Catholic Church and a member of the former Rosary Alter Society. Louise was a member of the Hospital Guild #5, The True Life and God prayer group which was held at her home every Friday evening. She volunteered at the Christian Thrift Shop in Upper Sandusky and

did volunteer work at the former Wyandot Manor. Louise enjoyed working crossword puzzles, reading, cooking, crafts, traveling to Rome and Medjugorje and she took great pride in keeping her home neat.
