Bert Corbin, 87, of Wharton went to be with the Lord on Aug. 12, 2007 at 5:20PM just after being moved from Blanchard Valley Hospital to Wyandot County Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. He was born Oct. 9, 1919 in rural Wharton, the son of Curt & Grace (Wise) Corbin, both deceased.

Mr. Corbin is survived by a daughter Barbara Fite and her companion Gary Williams, Wharton, son James Corbin, Wharton, sister Mildred Zehfus, Upper Sandusky, 5 grandchildren Mrs. Beth (Tim) Apple, North Baltimore, Mrs. Rhonda (Scott) Shifflet, Wharton, David Fite & Dana Shutters, Middleton, WI, Jeremy (Deneen) Corbin, Mt. Blanchard & Angie (Steve) Ford, Findlay. They had 8 great grandchildren, 6 step great grandchildren, 3 step great great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by 4 brothers Alva, Ira, Ralph, & Bill Corbin and 2 sisters Florence Vogel & Golda Boose and 1 great grandson Seth Corbin.

He was a graduate of Wharton High School class of 1938. Mr. Corbin was a army veteran, serving for 45 months in WW11. He also served in Europe as a sharpshooter, BAR marksman, machine gun expert for 17 months with the rank of Sergeant of a 610 tank destroyer crew and he was connected with the Patton army in charge. He was a farmer, barber, Riverdale School bus driver

for 27 years. He also drove truck and snow plow for the Richland Township for 23 years. He loved the outdoors, animal hunting, mushroom hunting and fishing. He especially enjoyed family get togethers.
