We had a lovely quiet afternoon. We talked of family, three and four generations now, and, of course, the conversation turned to God, His Gospel, and His Goodness.

When she inquired, my husband assured her we are in fact believers, and proud of it.

Suddenly, Aunt Betty leaped to her feet! Kicking her considerably long legs over our heads, her hands flying heavenwards, smiling as broad as the Ohio River Valley, she began shouting "HALLELUJAH!!!", to which my husband gleefully joined in! It was a moment of the old-time religion in Ohio, I'd told him about...happening live, in all it's joy and spectacle! Would that we
