Daniel A. Kirchner age 85 of West Finley St., Upper Sandusky, OH died at Fairhaven Health Care Community at 12:15 AM on Saturday December 1, 2007.

He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Little Falls, N.Y.

He enjoyed golf, bicycling, ballroom dancing, watching sports on T.V., swimming, snow skiing, hunting, and fishing in the Adirondack Mts. of N.Y. He was a fan of the N.Y. Yankee Baseball team.

Dan was very proud that he was a descendent of Adam Helmer depicted in the book "Drums a long the Mohawk" by Walter Edmonds. He played an important part in the history of the Mohawk Valley during the revolution in 1778.

A Funeral Service will be held on Wednesday December 5, 2007 at 11:30AM with Rev. Mary Curtis officiating. Burial will be in the St. Peter's Catholic Cemetery, Upper Sandusky, OH. Visitation is from 10:30AM until the time of service on Wednesday.
