Don L. Shirk, 84, of Gormley St. Forest, OH died at 6:35AM Wed. Sept. 5, 2007 at The Corinthian Nursing Home, Kenton, OH. He was born June 24, 1923 in Peoria, OH to Don B. & Ada (Mame) Shirk, both deceased.

Mr. Shirk married Ruth E. Peart on Sept. 7, 1943 and she survives. Also surviving is 1 Son, Dean (Betty) Shirk, Wharton, OH, 2 Grandchildren, Donnie & Jackie Shirk, 1 Brother, Floyd Shirk, Marysville, OH. He was preceded in death by 3 Brothers.

Mr. Shirk was a WWII Veteran who served in the US Army as a paratrooper and medic. He was the owner/operator of Shirk's Barber Shop, Forest, OH for over 50 years until his retirement in 2002. Mr. Shirk also worked nights at the Marion Correctional Institute. He and his wife also ran the former Shirk's grocery store in Kirby, OH.

Mr. Shirk was member of the First Baptist Church, Kenton, OH where he served as a church Deacon. He was a member of the Forest Masonic Lodge, Odd Fellows, McVitty VFW Post 1182 and American Legion Post 259 both of Forest, OH. Mr. Shirk served on the Forest City Council for many years. He enjoyed reading, golfing, fishing, handing-out chewing gum and doing magic tricks for all the kids in town.
