Edward John Spicka, age 76, of Annhurst St. Fairfax, VA was called to his eternal home on Sat. May 17, 2008 at 10:47 a.m. in the Mt. Vernon Hospital, Alexandria, VA. after a long and valiant struggle with non-Hodgkins lymphoma and neuropathy. He was born Aug. 2, 1931 in Cicero, IL, the son of Jan and Rose (Fabianski) Spicka. Edward (Ed) is survived by his devoted wife of 52 years Colleen R. Albert, daughter of Homer and Lucille Albert of Cheverly, MD whom he married on June 2, 1956 at Metropolitan Baptist Church (currently known as Capitol Hill Baptist Church) and she survives in Fairfax, VA. They were united in marriage by Dr. Clyde W. Taylor, Executive Director of the National Association of Evangelicals. Also surviving is his brother-in-law John R. Albert and his wife Leila Albert of Las Vegas, NV. Ed worked as a civil engineer for Fairfax County for 32 years and, with his wife, made his home in Fairfax, VA for the past 38 years. He was gifted artist and musician, who also enjoyed history, nature and travel. Ed was blessed with many friends who benefited from his wit and generosity. After attending school in Chicago, he joined the United States Navy, and served from 1950 to 1954 during the Korean War with the Heavy Attack Squadron VC-7, aboard the USS Coral Sea in Port Lyautey, French Morocco, North Africa.
