



Everett O. Obenour

December 29, 1935 - January 17, 2021

Everett "Obie" Oyama Obenour age 85 of McComb, died on Sunday January 17, 2021 at Bridge Hospice Care Center in Findlay. He was born on December 29, 1935 in Dola, to Oyama Herbert Irvin and Viola (McCleary) Obenour. He married May Kay and adopted her two sons.

Surviving are his children Rob Obenour of Van Buren, Jim (Vicki) Obenour of Queen Creek, AZ, Kristi of North Carolina, Chad (Heidi) Obenour of Wharton, 11 grandchildren Austin, Corey, Kaylee, Jordan, Kayma, Kayler, Garrett, Kevin, Luis, Fernando, Victor and 4 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a sister Leora.

Everett "Obie" graduated from Upper Sandusky High School. He was a Veteran of the United States Air Force serving from 1958-1962. He became a refrigeration specialist at the Plattsburg Air Force Base in New York and received the Guided Missile Insignia at Vandenberg Air Force Base in California.

Everett was a commercial heating/air conditioning specialist and owner/operator of Obenour Company. He was sub hired by Sears, Bepplers Staley Plumbing, Nesbitt and the University of Toledo.

Everett was member of Van Buren United Methodist Church for 35 years. He

was past Vice President and member of the Refrigeration Service Engineers Society, LaSertoma International, Hancock County Sheriffs Posse and Findlay Bowlers Association. For hobbies he enjoyed horseback riding, barrel racing, boating, motorcycling and restoring his 1950 Dodge pickup.



· One of my proudest moments as a parent was when Caroline was in 4th grade. She was in gym and another little girl got beamed in the face with a basketball. All the kids ran to her to console her but Caroline told her “there are 2 good things about that...” I can literally hear Obie’s breathless laugh every time I think about it.

· I think of all the times I had to take my old truck over to him to fix. He always called me Goodwrench because of my lack of mechanical skills. Especially when I put mud flaps on it backwards.

· I think of my drives to work with him to Toledo this was my first real job and I was killing my self for it. One time it was my turn to drive home. I had myself totally stressed out and had a migraine. I asked Obie to drive and hoped to close my eyes and take a knap. Obie drove but I didn’t get a knap. Instead I got lecture all the way home about how I wasn’t doing them a favor and sometimes You have to break to clear your mind. Etc. I’ve used that advice hundreds of times in my career and solved countless problems while taking a short break.

· I think of camping and trail riding at hocking hills and the bad egg coffee he would make on the campfire. I’d love to share another cup of that coffee with him!

· I think of the time Chad tried to teach me to ride the Motorcycle. I made a slow turn hit some gravel wiped out. Chad was afraid to tell him that I was driving. So he had to take the fall for it. For years every time I saw Obie he’d say I needed to kick chad in the knee for wrecking the bike on me. (I think he knew)

· I think of all the weekends I’d spend on the couch in living room. Chad and I may be out all night, but he made sure we got up for Church Sunday morning. (I still go to church every Sunday)

· I think of the great legacy Obie left through his kids and the
