He died Sunday, July 24, 2005, at his residence.

He was born June 24, 1934, in Forest, to William Lee and Lula Del (Musgrave) Woolley and they preceded him in death. He married Lee Ann Sturgis on June 5, 1959, in Kenton, and she survives.

A 1952 graduate of Forest High School, Mr. Woolley served in the U.S. Army for eight years and obtained the rank of sergeant. He retired in 1980 from the former United Aircraft Products as plant tour superintendent. He and his son Eric then owned and operated E&M Metal Fabrication in Bradenton, from which he retired in 2000 and moved to Tennessee.

Mr. Woolley was a Forest Village Council member during the 1960s and also was a volunteer firefighter. He was a past member of McVitty VFW Post No. 1182, Forest, and of the Moose Lodge in Bradenton. He enjoyed the outdoors, especially vegetable and flower gardening, animals, farm life, fixing things and tinkering with machinery.
