Mrs. Shields founded the Shields Funeral Home, Forest, in 1935 with her husband.

She was Past noble Grand of Virginia Rebekah Lodge 363, Forest, a member of Forest United Methodist Church, church organist for 39 years, and was Past President of its United Methodist Women. She was a member of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority, Forest, Forest Mothers's Study League, Past President of Lima Dist. United Methodist Women. She was also a former Sunday School teacher and Sunday School Superintendent. She was Past Matron of Senate Chapter 70 OES, Forest. She was also very active in the Forest Alumni Association. Fran and her husband, Joe, were also the Tree Festival Parade Grand Marshalls in 1983.
