employed at many locations living in many states throughout the United States and abroad. He worked for several years on the Alaskan Pipeline and in the Philippines, at international airports and conventional power plants. He was a member of the Local 123 Pipefitters Union. He worked on “anything that went through a pipe.”

He was member of the Elks, Moose Lodge, American Legion, VFW and several other associations throughout his life.

He wrote a book “My First 84 Years”. He enjoyed motor homes, extended traveling and rock collecting. He had resided at Westbrook Assisted Living and Memory Care Facility, Upper Sandusky, where he and his wife were crowned King and Queen of the Senior Center and attended the Wyandot County Fair, the fall of 2014.
