Patricia was a 1948 Salutatorian of Marseilles High School. By the age of 22 she was a dedicated homemaker and mother of three; she gardened, canned and froze fruits and vegetables; she cooked, baked, cleaned, and sewed clothing for the family. Her love of holiday and family traditions has transcended the generations that follow her.

Employment prior to marriage consisted of the North Electric Plants in Kenton and Upper Sandusky and Turner's Restaurant, Forest, OH. Later she was employed by Avon Products in the early 1960's, Burke Neville 1962-65, Rudolph's in Westminster, OH, 1965, Kenton North Electric 1966-68, Westinghouse in Upper Sandusky 1968, Kenton Molded Plastics, and Kenton Essex (United Technologies) 1965-66 and 1969-1990? After the closing of the plant she worked at McBride's Furniture Store, Forest until 1996.

She was a member and/or attended the Roundhead Methodist Church, Holden Fletcher Chapel Church, the Forest Presbyterian Church, the Forest

First Baptist Church, and the Heritage Christian Union Church.

She enjoyed travels in Colorado, family get-togethers, reading, and watching her grandsons play sports, and listening to her granddaughter play the piano.
