Paul B. Nance, age 89, of Upper Sandusky died at 6:35 p.m. Monday, March 14, 2011 in the Wyandot County Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. Born on August 23, 1921 in South Bloomfield, Ohio he was the son of the late Charles W. and Elizabeth A. (Hoover) Nance.

On Jan. 24, 1947 he married Jane L. Hawthorne in Columbus, Ohio she resides in Upper Sandusky. He is survived by his children Terry L. (Connie) Nance, London, Ohio, Pamela T. Paul retired as a salesman from Armour Dial Corporation, Columbus after 40 years of employment.

He was a life member of American Legion Post #225 and Elks #83 both of

Upper Sandusky.

Mr. Nance enjoyed golfing, fishing and participated in many sports early in his life. He was an avid vegetable and flower gardener and loved to travel especially to the New England States.
