Pearl Wisner, 91, a resident of the Wyandot Manor Nursing Home, Upper Sandusky, and formerly of Wharton, died at 7:15 a.m. Tuesday, May 18, 1999, at the nursing home.

She was born Sept. 15, 1907, in Berwick to Frank A. and Emma R. (Cromer) Wehrle. She married John L. Long on Jan. 31, 1928, and he died July 14, 1960. She married George L. Wisner on Nov. 18, 1961, and he died Aug. 6, 1972.

Surviving are one daughter, Mrs. Jack (Skippy) Opper, Wharton; six grandchildren; and 14 great-grandchildren.

She also was preceded in death by one son, Carl C. Long; one grandson; one great-grandson; five brothers; and four sisters.

Mrs. Wisner was a homemaker.

She was a member of Wharton Church of God and its WCSC. She also was a member of the Wyandot County Senior Citizens, serving on the board of trustees for 22 years. She was named Wyandot County's "Outstanding Senior Citizen" in 1990.

Mrs. Wisner was active with the Wharton Fest from 1946-93 and served as grand marshal in 1990. She was a 63-year member of the Rebekah Lodge and Patriach Militant Ladies Auxiliary in Findlay. She was active with the Wharton and Wyandot County boards of elections until 1993.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Friday at Shields Funeral Home, Forest, the Rev. Jerry Harper officiating. Burial will be in Wharton Cemetery.
