“ No one made me laugh more than Ray! Testament to his heart and how he loved to make others smile, with his humble approach to life and love for humor.

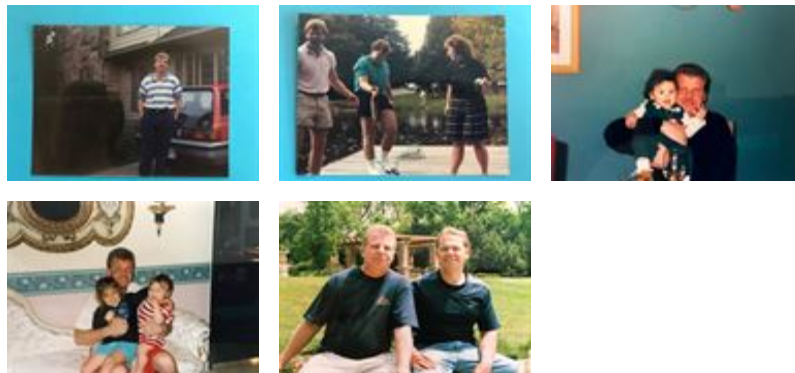
