Robert McElwee, age 90 formerly of Fremont died at 8:25 a.m. Mon. Aug. 6, 2012 in the Wyandot County Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. He was born Dec. 19, 1921 in Waterford, Ireland to the late Robert and Harriet Maude (Caswell) McElwee.

He married Violet Marie Culver on May 3, 1959 in Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church. She preceded him in death on Jan. 28, 2000. He is survived by 2 sisters Hilda Dabkowski and Pat (Ben) Vogel, both of Clearwater, FL. Mr. McElwee was preceded in death by 2 sisters Vilolet Locke and Doris Hichcock, and a brother Fred McElwee.

At the age of 14 Mr. McElwee moved from Ireland to England where he finished his schooling at age 16. At the age of 19 he enlisted in British Royal Air Force where served for 6 years. He was a flight mechanic during WWII. In 1949 after the war he and his mother moved to the United States. Mr. McElwee retired in 1980 from Tiffin Art Metal after 16 years where he was an inspector and prior to that he had worked for Herbron Industries, Fremont.
