### WW II ARMY VETERAN

Robert L. Huntley, Upper Sandusky, died at 10:30 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 26, 2008 at Hardin Memorial Hospital, Kenton. He was 82.

Born July 21, 1925 in Marion, he was a son of Homer and Gertrude (Moore) Huntley. He married Anna Mae Miller on April 5, 1969 and she survives in Upper Sandusky.

Mr. Huntley also is survived by a son, Michael, Upper Sandusky; two daughters, Cheryl Bosart, Marion; and Annette Byrd, Cardington; seven grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren, including Tyler Fox, who was raised by Mr. Huntley and his wife; and three sisters, Caroline Jones, Geneva Hatcher and Patty Crager, all of LaRue.

He was preceded in death by two sisters.

A 1943 LaRue High School graduate, Mr. Huntley retired from farming after 46 years. He retired from Whirlpool Corp., Marion, in 1990 after 34 years.

He served in the United States Army in the 44th Tank Battalion in the Philippines and Japan in World War II.

Mr. Huntley was a member of Marseilles United Methodist Church.

He also was a member of the 44th Tank Battalion Association and the 12th Armored Association.

He was a former member of Amvets No. 777, Upper Sandusky.

The funeral is at 11 a.m. Thursday at Marseilles United Methodist Church with the Rev. Tim Benjamin officiating. Burial will be in LaRue Cemetery. Military rites will be performed by McVitty VFW Post No. 1182 and American Legion Post No. 259, both of Forest. Visitation is from 2-5 p.m. Wednesday at Clark-Shields Funeral Home, Forest, and an hour before the service at the church Thursday.
