William Joseph (Bill) Vaughn, age 81, of Walker St. Upper Sandusky died at his residence on Wed. July 16, 2008 at 5:35 p.m. He was born near Carey, OH on October 25, 1926. Bill was the son of the late William Allen and Cecelia M. (Sontag) Vaughn. He married Margery Thiel who preceded him in death on November 20, 1998. They were married on September 17, 1949 in St. Peter's Catholic Church.

He is survived by three daughters Jeanne (Bill) Coppler and Karen (Kip) Binau of Carey and Nancy (Chip) Hill of Upper Sandusky and two sons, Thomas (Becky) and Dennis (Maria) of Upper Sandusky. Commission Company where he was branch manager in Carey. He later became general manager in Upper Sandusky in 1981. He retired in 1989. He was a member of the Transfiguration of the Lord Catholic Church and active on the church and school committees. He sang in the church choir for 30 years. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus Lodge #2050 where he was past grand knight and Stone Crossing Golf Club, Upper Sandusky. He was also a past member of American Legion Post No. 225 and Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks #83, Upper Sandusky. In the late 1940's, he was an advisor of the Carey Boys 4-H. Mr. Vaughn enjoyed and loved his family and friends. He also had many friends at the Crawford County Dialysis Center in Bucyrus. His hobbies included wine making, gardening, genealogy, playing dominoes, studying history, especially Wyandot County and WWII. Most recently, he enjoyed spending time at his pond (Wilmar) and cabin.
